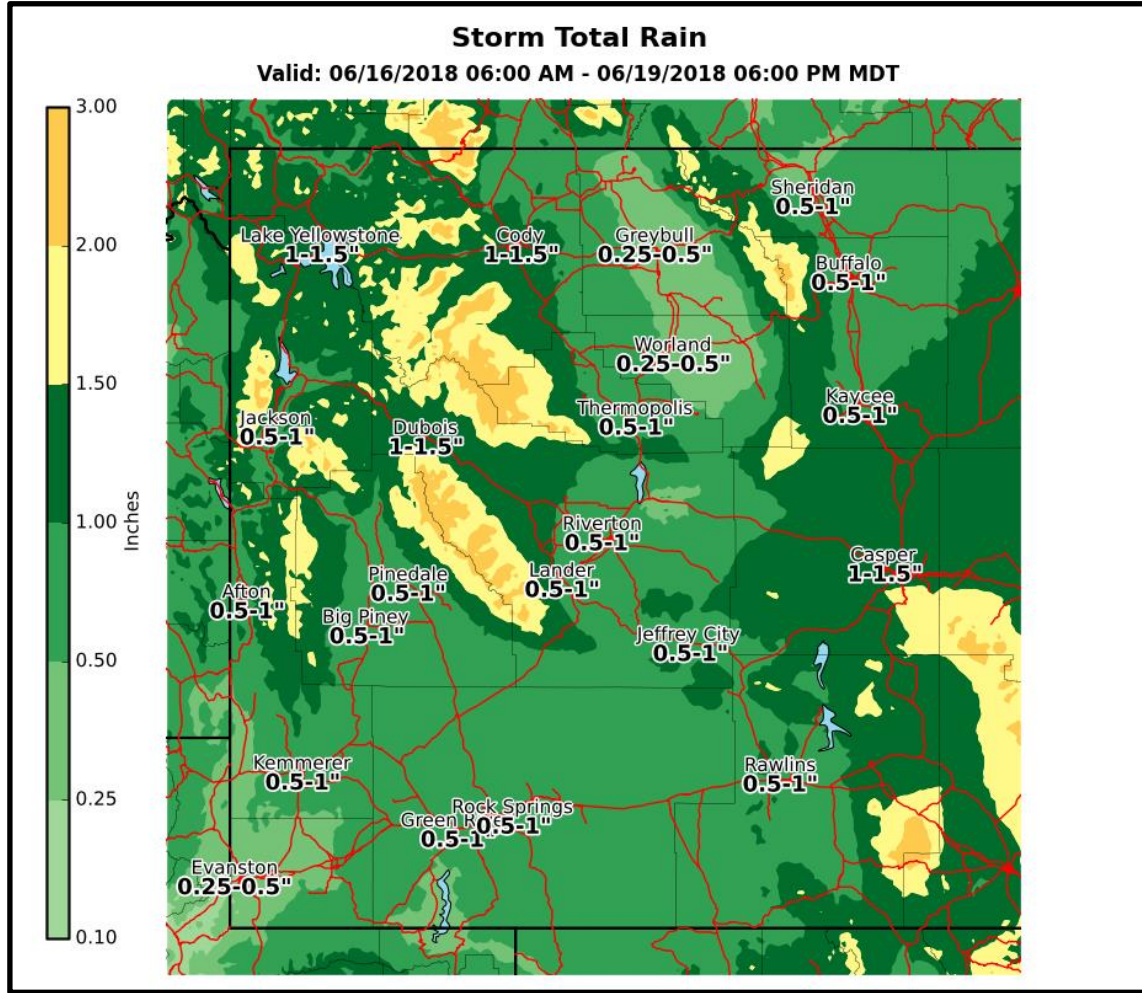




Strong Storms North Today, Heavy Rain Possible Sunday through Tuesday



Message of the Day:

- Isolated strong thunderstorms today (6/15) with hail and heavy rain being the main hazards.
- Widespread heavy rain is possible Sunday through Tuesday, especially across northwest Wyoming
- Elevations above 11,000 feet are likely to see accumulating snowfall of potentially several inches

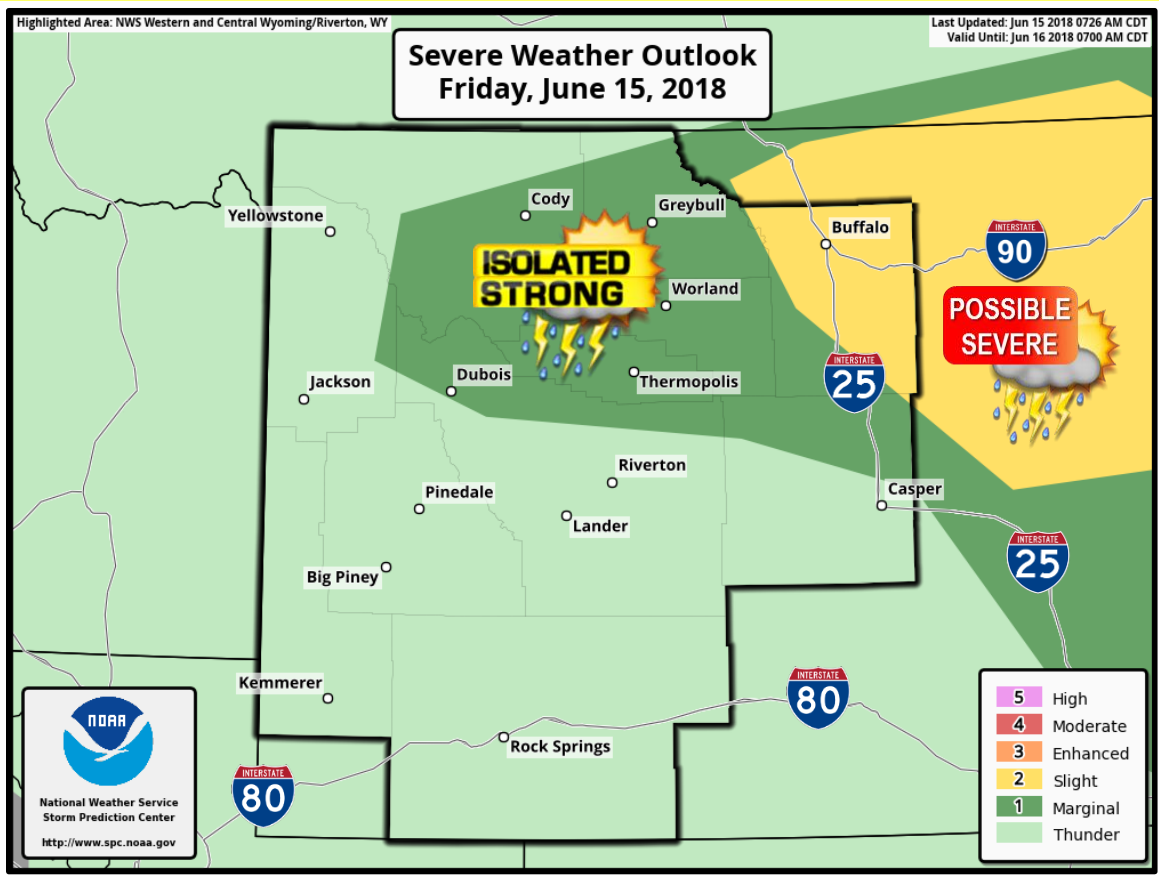


Important Forecast Changes:

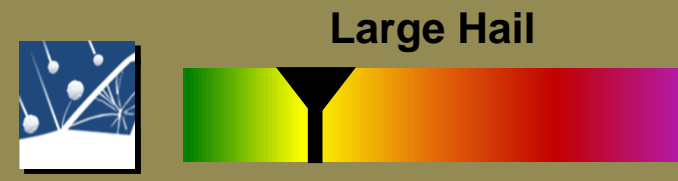
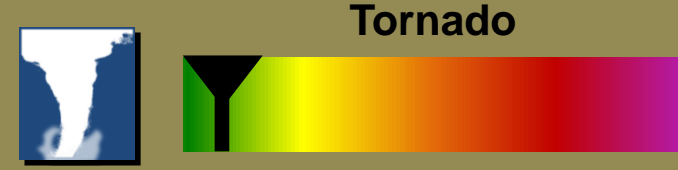
Added mention of isolated strong thunderstorms across northern parts of the area for this afternoon (6/15) and evening.

Severe Threat Level for Today



What: Isolated strong to possibly severe thunderstorms.

When: Afternoon & Evening

Where: Best chance across the Big Horn Basin and Johnson County (darker shade of green and yellow)

What: Large Hail and heavy rain are the main hazards





Quick Summary

- Isolated strong thunderstorms especially over the north with the primary hazards of hail and very heavy rainfall
- Mountain areas of northwest Wyoming could receive one to two inches of rain over a three-day period (Sunday – Tuesday)
- Lower elevations could see widespread 0.50” to 1.00” rainfall totals
- Elevations above 11,000 feet may receive several inches of snow
- Recreational activities, particularly in the mountains, will be impacted by the wet and cool weather beginning Sunday
- Mud or rock slides are possible in steeply sloped areas.
