Hello Teton Flood Stakeholders,

NWS Riverton has issued a situation report regarding the weather system moving in this week. We have a Winter Storm Watch for the surrounding mountains through Thursday night, then a very moist system moving in Saturday afternoon and evening with up to .5" of rain. This is similar to the situation we had a couple weeks back that caused snowmelt flooding in several areas of the County. See the attached SitRep for further information.
