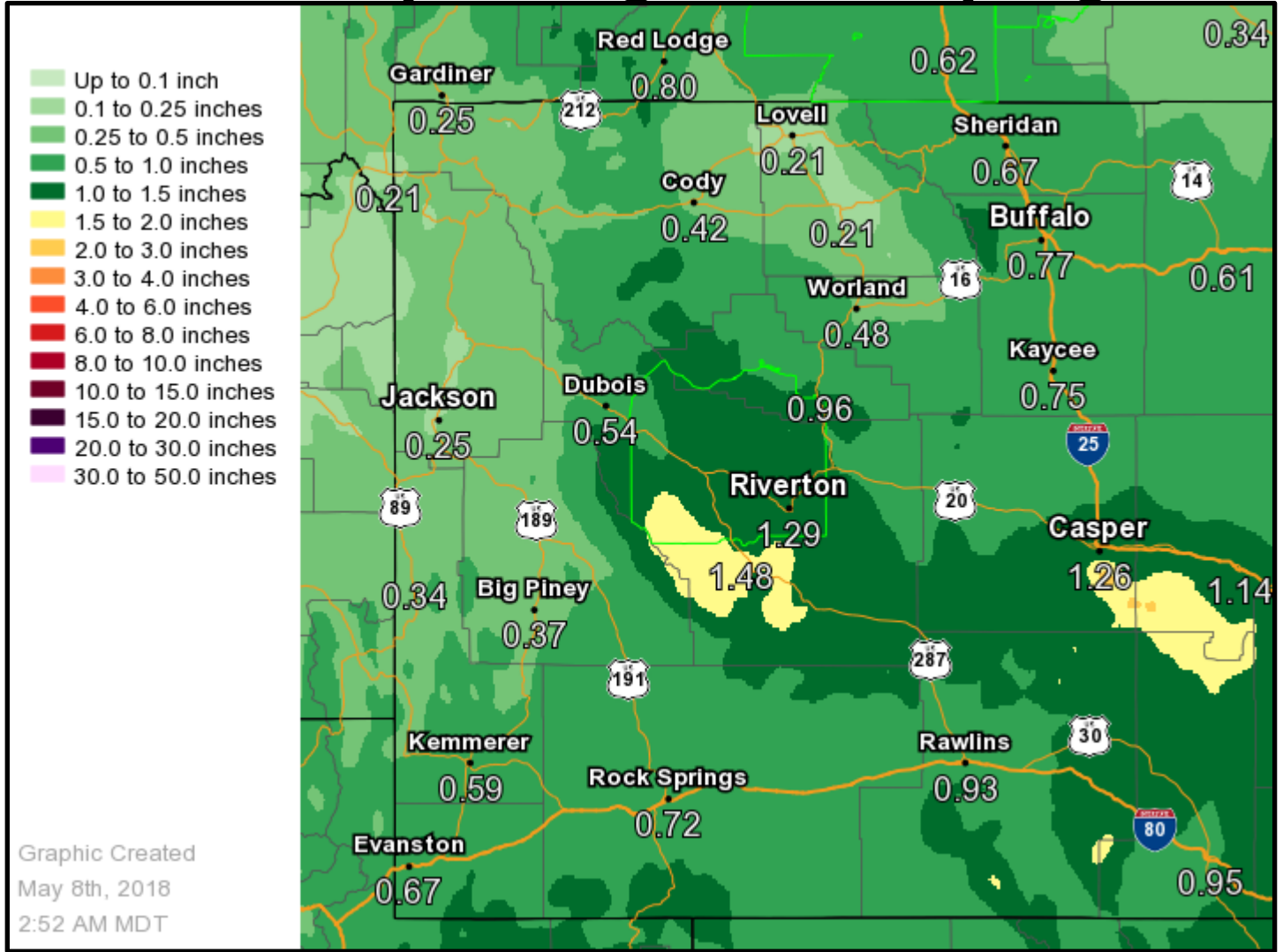


Rising Rivers and Creeks

Early Look at Precipitation Amounts for Friday through Saturday Night



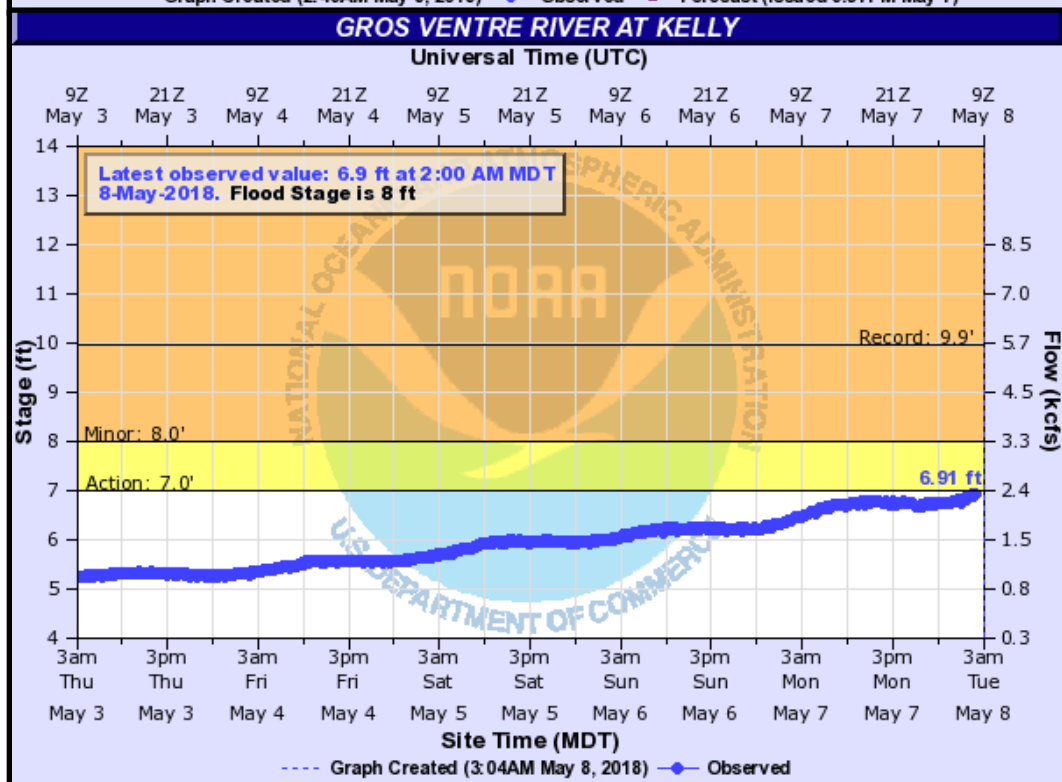
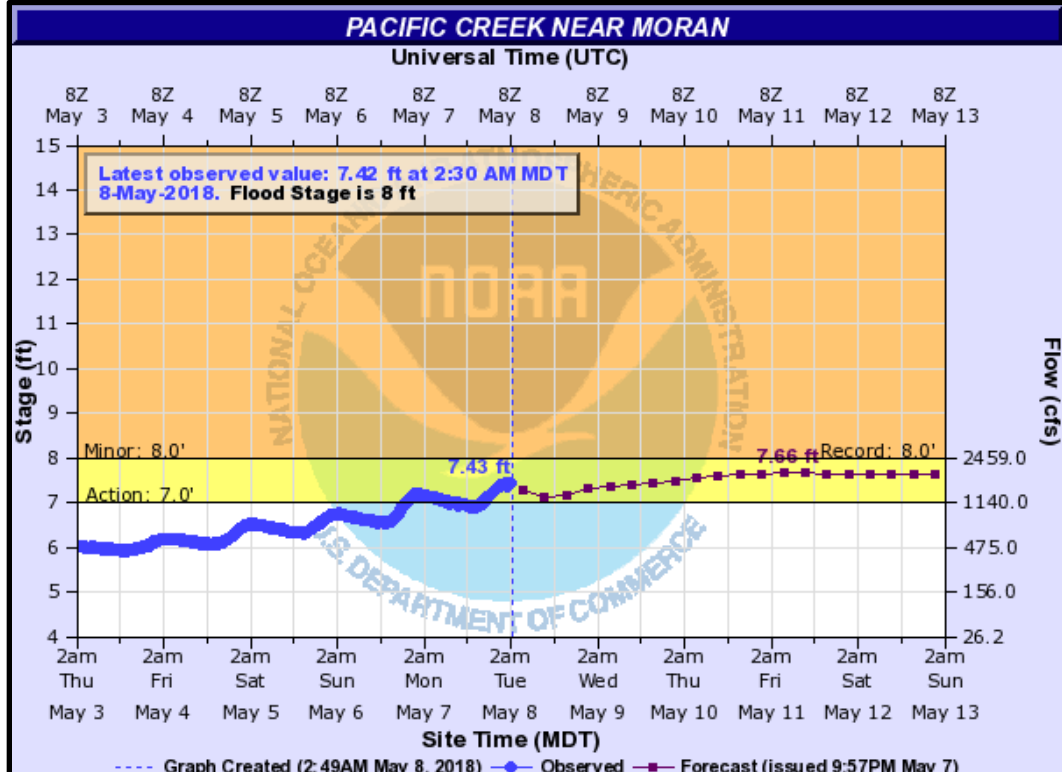
Message of the Day:

- Well above average temperatures through Wednesday will result in mountain snowmelt, and continued rises on area creeks and rivers.
- A cool, wet storm system will impact the Cowboy State Friday and Saturday. Significant valley rain, and a heavy, wet mountain snow could occur centered around the Fremont and Natrona counties.



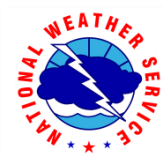


Pacific Creek & Gros Ventre River (Teton County)

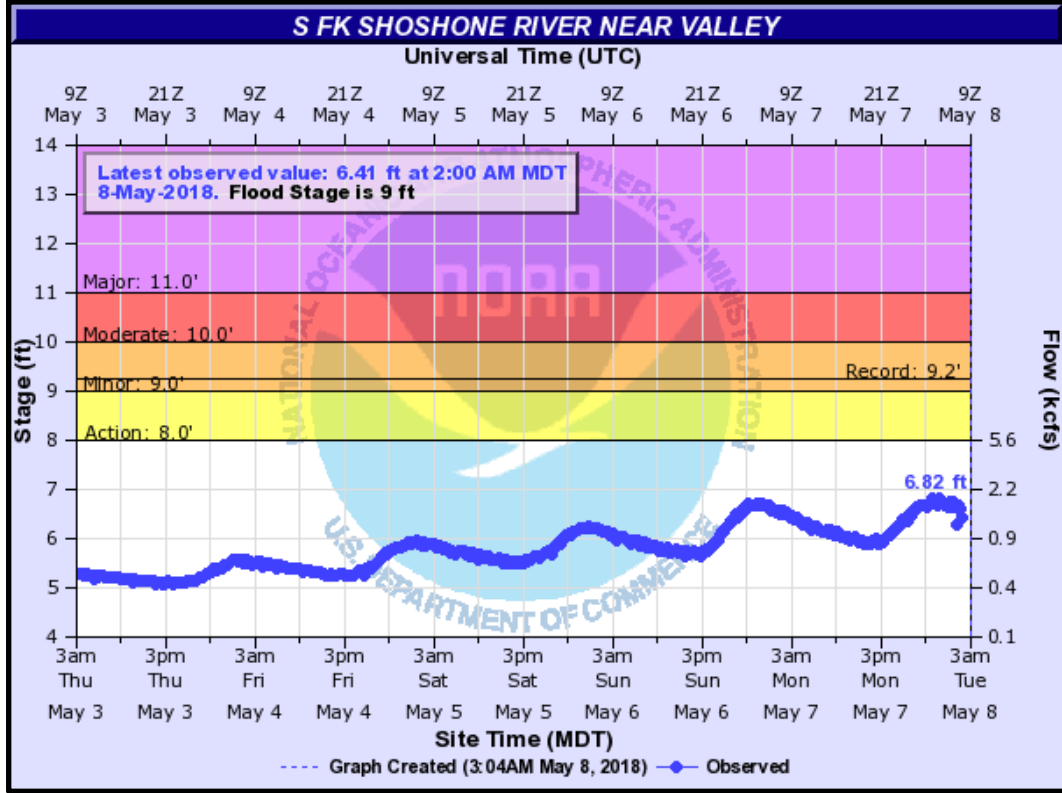
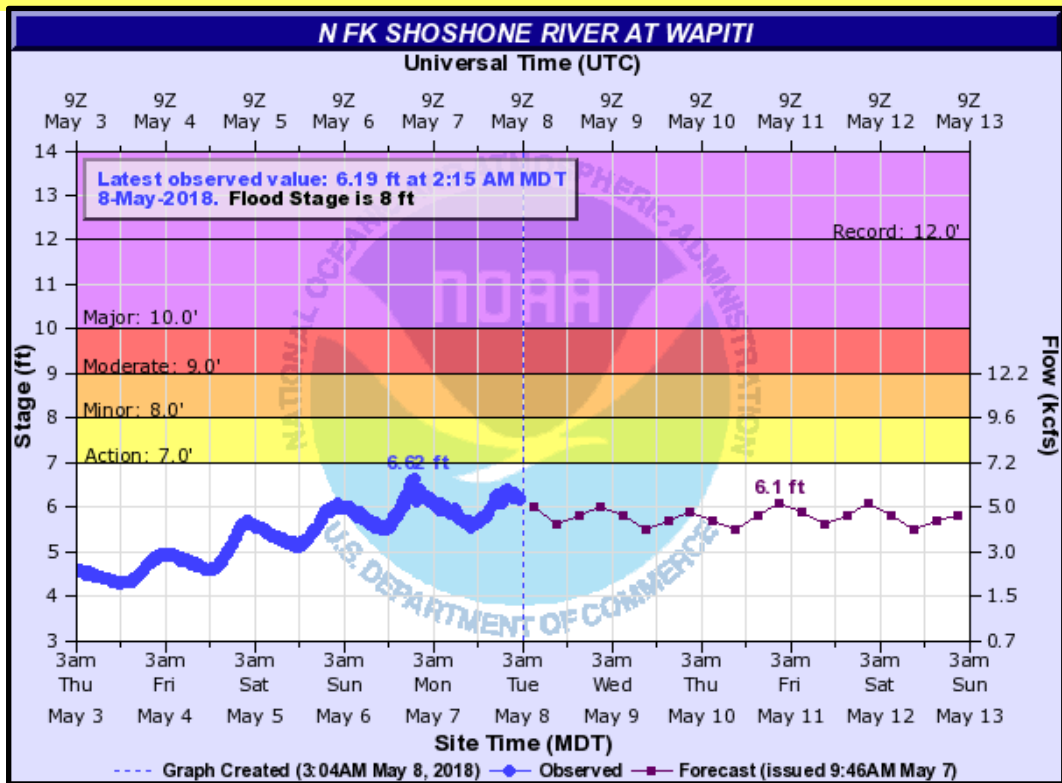


Impacts: Bankfull conditions with minor low-lying flooding.





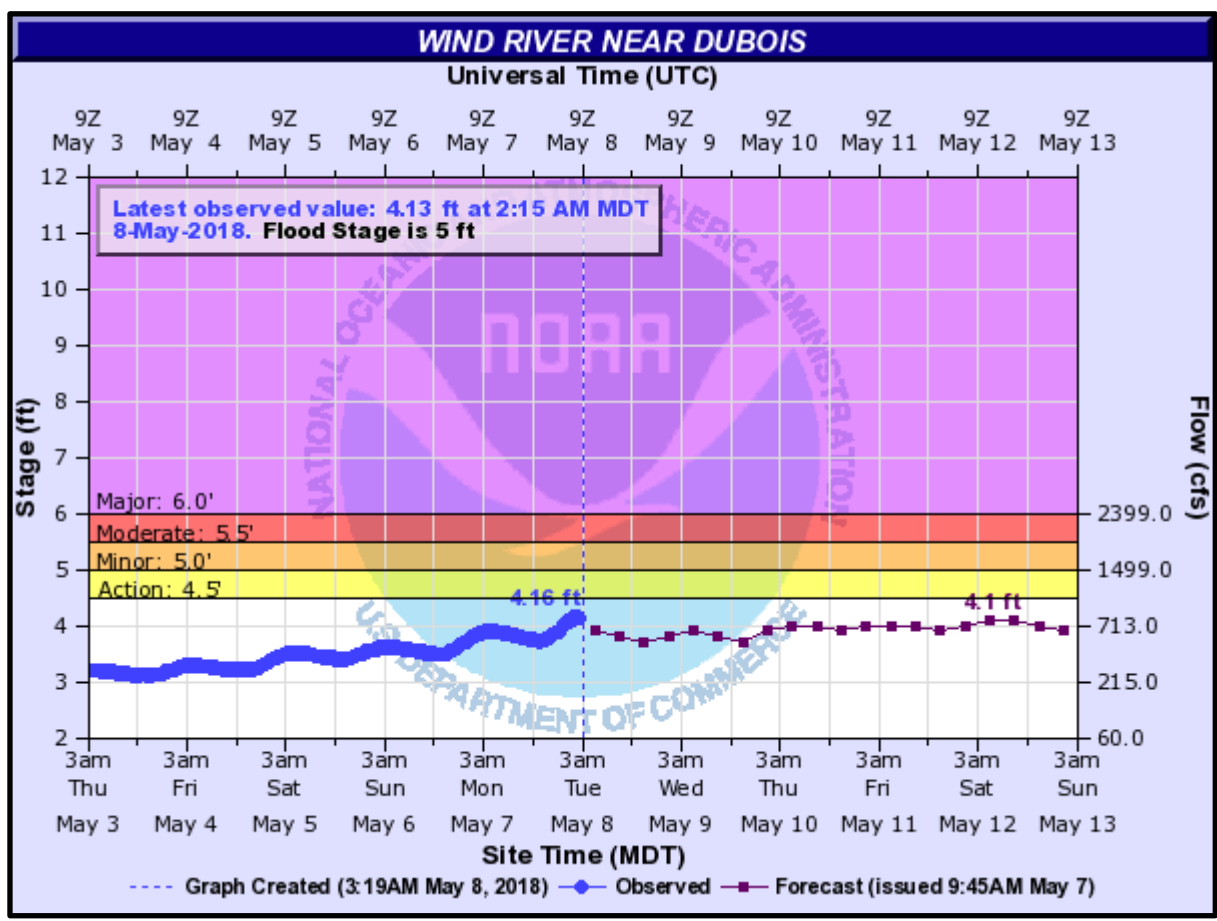
North & South Forks of Shoshone River (Park Co.)

Impacts: Remaining just below bankfull.



Quick Summary

- Unseasonably warm temperatures through Wednesday
- Be alert to rising river levels – headwater creeks & streams usually peak during the early morning hours. River stages & forecasts can be obtained on the NWS Riverton website at: <https://water.weather.gov/ahps2/index.php?wfo=RIW>
- Equipment & livestock should be moved from low-lying areas
